

Coming to the Table Community Activities Committee

The Community Activities Committee develops the annual activity plan for CTTT and assists with its implementation.

The duties of the Community Activities Committee include:

- Develop the annual community activity plan to include such activities as:
 - Host topical conference calls
 - Support local and regional gatherings
 - Support hosting periodic National Gathering efforts
 - Encourage and support Working Groups
 - Encourage and support commemorations of significant events, such as: 150th Anniversary of key moments in Civil War history (runs through April 2015), 50th Anniversary of “I Have a Dream”/march on Washington (8/28/13), 50th Anniversary of assassination of Medgar Evers (6/12/63), annual MLK Day, Black History Month, Juneteenth, Annual U.N. Day of Remembrance, birthdays of key historic figures
 - Start/encourage/support a “reading/book and film club” in which the discussion would take place via conference call (tied to Conference Call efforts) potential host/organizer could come from a wide cross-section of CTTT membership; from authors/filmmakers to someone who is excited about a book or film they want to talk about
 - Explore ways to offer support to institutions facing challenges in connection with legacy of slavery/racism
 - Support other activities appropriate to the CTTT vision, mission, goals and objectives.
- Provide cost estimates for activities to the Executive Committee for inclusion in the CTTT annual budget.
- Assist staff and local/regional gathering leaders with the implementation of the plan.
- Spearhead the planning and implementation of the annual National Gathering.
- Make regular reports to the board on its activities.
